Interviews, documents help record Calgary AA history

A committee dedicated to collecting and preserving the history of Alcoholics Anonymous in Calgary needs the help of long-time AA members, as well as city and area groups.

The Archives Committee is interested in talking to any AA member in Calgary and area who has been involved with the program for 30 years or more, says Tim H., chairperson.

"We want to talk to these early members about their history of sobriety and the early days of AA in Calgary," says Tim H. "The first AA meetings were held in Calgary in 1945 - 63 years ago. It is important that we document the experiences of these first members so we can create a record of how AA has evolved in Calgary and area over the years."

The Archives Committee wants to record interviews with early members to create an oral history. A list of 30 questions has been prepared to serve as a guide for the interview. 
