What about sponsorship?

How does a newcomer or any member of Alcoholics Anonymous find a sponsor? And, what sort of qualifications do you need to be a sponsor?

Those were two questions on the minds of about 60 Calgary AA members at a recent sponsorship workshop hosted by District 79. "There is no simple answer to the questions," says Duane T., a long time A.A. member who facilitated the workshop.

He says the A.A. pamphlet on sponsorship is probably the best source of information.

For finding a sponsor it says: "The process of matching newcomer and sponsor is as informal as everything else in A.A. Often the new person simply approaches a more experienced member who seems compatible and asks that member to be a sponsor."

And for anyone wondering about qualifications to be a sponsor it says: "The most successful sponsors are



men and women who have been in A.A. long enough to have some understanding of the suggested recovery program outlined in the Twelve Steps.length of sobriety is a factor, but not the only factor, in successful sponsorship. Of equal importance are an individual's capacity for understanding and patience, and willingness to devote time and effort to new members..." In the District 79 workshop, which was made up of people looking for

sponsors, those looking to be sponsors and those who are current sponsors, participants were asked to sketch out their concept of what a sponsor looks like (see samples at left), and then write down key words they felt described a sponsor, from both the sponsee and sponsor perspective.

The exercise, didn't identify specific sponsors or prospective sponsees, but it did get everyone thinking and talking about sponsorship qualities and traits. Of those participating in the workshop, 85 percent were sponsees, 53 percent were sponsors, while the rest were interested in service sponsees or sponsorship. Here are top qualities or characteristics sponsees felt a sponsor should have. The sponsor should be: 1. someone

who is doing the 12 Steps themselves; 2. someone who can be trusted; 3. someone who does not judge; 4. someone who helps the

sponsee to be honest with themselves - calls them on their B.S.; and , 5. is prepared and able to share their experience, strength and hope.

Among those seeking to be sponsors, here are the top characteristics or traits they felt a sponsor should have. They felt a sponsor should be someone who: 1, is able to carry the

message; 2. works the steps in all of their affairs; 3. has a good sense of humor; 4. is non-judgmental and is accepting; and 5. loves to see sponsees who are passionate about change.

The District 79 workshop was only the second time Duane T. had facilitated that format of a sponsorship workshop and he hoped to be able to share the approach with other Calgary and area districts.





According the most recent survey conducted by A.A. General Service Office there are about 4,900 A.A. groups in Canada with a combined membership of about 96,000 people.

In the United States there are about 54,000 A.A. groups with a combined membership of 1.3 million.

In Canada and the U.S. there are about 2,500 groups in correctional facilities, with a combined membership of 64,000 people.

And around the world there are 227 individual men and women who describe themselves as Loners. These are people living in isolated areas where it was not possible to form a group. Many achieved sobriety solely through study of A.A. literature.
