The program works, if you do

Work the program and it will work for you was the message brought to about 1,000 Calgary and area A.A. members attending the 28th annual Gratitude Roundup in June.

Speakers from Canada and the U.S. made the point several times, during the two-day Roundup that sitting on the sidelines, or applying "half measures" brought no long-lasting sobriety until they fully surrendered and began honestly working the program.

Ray M. of Calgary, who marked 27 years of sobriety in mid-June, opened the conference with an inspiring talk on how he finally got honest with himself in 1982. He recalled many years of drinking that started when he was 13, being a young man "full of attitude" living a life "that was all about me" and pushing every limit.

"My thinking was if you're not living on the edge you're taking up too much room, " said Ray M. He drank, did drugs, and struggled with bouts of uncontrollable rage that over the years threatened to destroy his family and a successful business.

Realizing he needed help, he dabbled in A.A. initially, but figured it wasn't for him. "I thought I had an educational deficiency," he said. "I thought I could learn to control my drinking."

Finally in 1982, after being in and out of A.A. rooms several times, he faced the reality of where he was. "It was a tough time. I had to make a decision. I

could give up everything that was important to me and stay drinking or I could go to A.A.," he said. "By the Grace of God I chose A.A."

Ray M. not only surrendered and turned his life over to a higher power, but also got active in the A.A. program and continues to be involved at the group, district level and area level. He has just completed a term as member of AA Grapevine Corporate Board in New York and was recently elected a member of the Calgary Central Office Management Committee.

Other highlights of the 2009 Roundup will be covered in future issues of The Westword. The sobriety countdown at the 2009 banquet totaled 4,988 years, 317 days of sobriety.
