The Area 78 Archives Committee will be addressing the vacancy at our Assembly in September (18,19,20). It is election time again this fall and it is important that as many groups as possible are represented as we will elect a new slate of trusted servants to keep the wheels turning.

In the broader A.A. world, G.S.O. General Manager, Phyllis H., presented a report on July 30, 2009 on the current status of the negotiations with Amazon Digital Services, Inc. (A.D.S.I.) regarding the Kindle project and explained that, based on the 30-day termination clause in the contract, a request to withdraw the Big Book on Kindle from the Amazon Website had been forwarded to A.D.S.I. on July 10, 2009. The Publishing Committee unanimously agreed to support the termination of the contract with Amazon Digital Services, Inc. upon completion of the stipulated 30 day period.

At the last General Service Conference, the long awaited Videos for Young People project was given

approval to move forward to the production stage. These videos ROCK! Their creation was a long and sometimes arduous process, but well worth the effort and the wait! They will be available for purchase in early September.

Exciting things have been happening in our fellowship and I look forward to sharing much, much more with everyone at our Assembly.
