December's Introductory Service Seminar

Calgary General Service Committee's semi-annual Introductory Service Seminar takes place December 3rd at Scarboro United Church and offers participants a comprehensive look at the different ways to be of service in our AA community. Representatives from the Calgary General Service Committee and Calgary Intergroup will address the audience about their mandates and how to become involved. The event is invariably uplifting and informative.

The seminar's organizer, Dana H explains, "AA's three legacies are Unity, Recovery and Service. Service is a fundamental aspect of our program and is essentially "how it works." We carry the message that was so freely given to us to the still suffering alcoholic, so that they too may know a new freedom and a new happiness. In turn, our own sobriety is richer. We keep what we have by giving it away."

Participants have many options when it comes to service work. CGSC and Intergroup will be represented at the seminar by members from Public Information, Cooperation with the Professional Community, Corrections and Treatment Facilities and AA Archives, to name a few. Participants also learn more about AA Service Structure as a whole — from General Service Representation at the group level to the AA World Services Board.

Dana offered several good reasons for participating, noting "Service opened up a door of rewarding experiences for me and best of all it offered the gift of fellowship. Service is a great way of connecting with members who most often become dear friends on the journey."

Tickets will be available as of October 31st through Group GSRs or Intergroup reps and at the Calgary Service Office until the week before the seminar. Tickets can also be purchased at the door; however AA members are encouraged to purchase them prior to the deadline to facilitate planning and for catering purposes. A.A. in Calgary was started by a non-alcoholic, the late Jack Johnson, who started A.A. in Calgary to help his brother who had a drinking problem. Unfortunately Jack's brother was not able to achieve sobriety but others have.

From the very first meeting in the basement of The York Hotel on October, 17th, 1945, and with God's Grace, we've continued to grow in effectiveness and to be of service to God and our fellows. Pioneers Dinner has become an annual event since October 2005. There were other old-timers dinners & old-timers month (Speaker Meetings) which was held at Dr. Carl Safran School for a number of years.

This annual dinner is to honour A.A. and give old-timers/long-timers the opportunity to share their experience, strength and hope and to show others how they recovered from a seemingly hopeless state of mind and body.
