Calgary and Area AA Service

Did you know, Alcoholics Anonymous has **two** major service bodies supporting Calgary and the surrounding area?

Did you know, any member of AA in the service area can attend and observe meetings of either of these two bodies? Your elected group representatives or their alternate are the only attendees with voting privileges but other interested members can observe these meetings at any time.

Did you know, both groups always have many service opportunities available for members of Alcoholics Anonymous? Many service opportunities require only sobriety and willingness, although others have recommended periods of sobriety or institutional requirements.

Below is a brief outline or summary of activities of the committees of CGSC and IG:

Calgary Intergroup (IG): IG is comprised of elected Intergroup representatives from local groups, and is the coordinating body for the provision of local services in Calgary and Area, through the Calgary Central Service Office (CSO) and the IG committees

Calgary Intergroup Steering Committee: Consists of the IG Chair, Alternate-Chair, Secretary, Treasurer and the subcommittee chairpersons; they coordinate the day to day operation of the subcommittees and provide subcommittee reports to the Intergroup body as a whole

Central Office Management Committee (COMC):

Consists of the IG chair, Alternate-Chair, Treasurer and 4 elected members-at-large (one who chairs the committee); they oversee and support the operation of the Calgary CSO and Book Store

Central Office and Bookstore: An Office Manager and part-time support staff provide accounting, administrative support and operate the bookstore

Calgary General Service Committee (CGSC):

CGSC is comprised of the General Service Representatives (GSRs) and coordinates local general service opportunities and special activities; sees that professionals receive correct information about our fellowship; keeps groups informed about AA as a whole; and assists groups or district as requested.

CGSC Steering Committee: Consists of a CGSC Chair, Alternate-Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer; they provide input to the General Service meetings.

Introductory Service Seminar (ISS): Organizes and co-ordinates semi-annual service seminars to attract and inform members for the various service opportunities that are available for the Calgary AA community.

Records and Registrations: Maintains the registrations of AA Groups and records of memberships

Telephone monitoring (403-777-1212): 24 hour service coverage for the Calgary AA phone number through volunteers, group participation and an answering service; maintains a "twelve step list" for calls to carry the message of AA to those in need

Banff Roundup: Organizes and hosts an annual weekend AA Roundup in Banff, usually in March

Public Information (PI): Provides support, materials and AA information to local interested organizations such as medical offices, schools, and community groups where alcohol can be a factor

Westword: A local information newsletter published monthly for AA members to keep members informed of events and other AA activities or information

Special Events: Organizes and hosts special events throughout the year such as the Christmas event and Stampede function

Calgary AA Archives: Compiles and maintains a collection of memorabilia representing Calgary's AA history; organizes displays of the archived materials

Sunday Morning Breakfast Meeting: Organizes and schedules a weekly breakfast speaker meeting supported by Calgary AA groups.

Cooperation with the Professional Community (CPC): Members carry the CPC message (what we are, how to find us, what AA does and does not do) to professionals. This may include personnel in the medical, human resources, education, law enforcement and social work fields

Grapevine Committee: Supports and encourages subscriptions of Grapevine magazine and notify members of other Grapevine publications and materials

Treatment Facilities: Members conduct meetings in the treatment facilities; supply support and encouragement by example while carrying the message of Alcoholics Anonymous to the treatment facility clients

Bridging the Gap (BTG): Coordinates activities with treatment facilities to support the transition of treatment facility clients from the facility to Alcoholics Anonymous meetings and the 12 step program

Corrections: Members carry the AA message into correctional facilities; work with young offenders and detainees in the facilities. A security screening may be required for this service opportunity.

The Big Book provides this observation on page 89, "Practical experience shows that nothing will so much insure immunity from drinking as intensive work with other alcoholics". This article provides information on various committees that perform service work in Calgary. If you're interested, talk to your group's GSR or IG representatives to find out more about available service opportunities or just contact the committees directly.
