Calgary Gratitude Round-up — Celebrating 30 Years

(Sponsored by the Calgary General Service Committee)

This spring marks the 30th anniversary of the Gratitude Round-up in Calgary. Being held June 10-12 at the Coast Plaza Hotel, it promises to be an amazing weekend of fellowship and music. With inspiring speakers and one of Calgary's best DJs, the event is expected to attract at least 900 people. The \$25 registration fee includes all of the speakers and two dances. For an additional \$40, participants can register for the Saturday night buffet banquet.

Gratitude Round-up Chair Kate K. noted, "We have phenomenal speakers lined up. This is a great place to meet people from all over the world, or to reconnect with AA members you haven't seen in years." Remembering her first round-up experience in Grande Prairie, Kate said "I was 30 days sober and just getting out of a treatment center. It was amazing to me to find so many sober people in one place. When you're young in sobriety, a round-up is an affirming experience."

This year's event will feature a Gratitude Globe where people can make donations to the work of the Central Office in New York City. Some AA groups also pool their resources to make an annual contribution. For those new to sobriety, Kate has this parting thought: "Come with an open heart and open mind. You're going to hear sensational stories that eclipse anything you've ever heard in a meeting. You might consider becoming a volunteer. Getting into service work lets you experience the round-up as an insider. It will keep you sober and you'll have fun."

Calgary General Service Committee

The Calgary General Service Committee (CGSC) is an important part of what makes AA tick. Here's a quick overview of its activities and volunteer opportunities.

CGSC is the body responsible for raising awareness about AA with professionals – institutional, health and social workers – working in Calgary's three jails, three hospitals and several treatment facilities. It coordinates AA-related services and activities at these institutions to reach alcoholics who need to hear the message. CGSC also provides a liaison with Calgary Intergroup, sponsors the annual Gratitude Round-up and Introductory Service Seminars, and assists with Group registration and records.

The CGSC meets at 7:30 pm the last Monday of the month. It plays a vital role in keeping local groups informed about city-wide service opportunities. Currently, about 80 groups have a representative at the meeting, but there is always room for more reps. A new program in the jails needs extra people to carry the message, and more volunteers at CGSC would also facilitate outreach to the professional community. 

GUIDELINES FOR 12 STEP WORK

- 1. We recommend a minimum of one year sobriety, or with your sponsor's approval.
- 2. Never go alone to their home or coffee shop if at all possible.
- 3. Men with men, women with women could be both sexes, but women should take the lead with a woman, and vice versa.
- 4. It is most important to not be judgmental on anything, especially their drinking.
- 5. Be patient, tolerant and understanding, no matter what they say, and try to follow this guideline: RGA
 - * R Remember where you came from and what it was like.
 - * G You are there to give back what was so freely given to you.
 - * A With these two things in mind, make yourself available to get them started; meetings, coffee etc.
- 6. Our Higher Power, through the telephone monitor has passed this responsibility to you the 12 stepper. Trust yourself to make the right choices, what to say and do. You are the hand of AA reaching out. Don't be afraid.
- 7. Trust your instincts, they're usually right.
- 8. Don't take anything they say personally. Use this if it helps for any objections; **Feel-Felt-Found**. (I know how you **feel**. I **felt** the same way. This is what I **found** helped.)
- 9. This may be only one little step on their road to recovery. Do not feel that you failed in any way if they don't get on the way to recovery right now. It may just mean they are one step closer to their bottom.
- 10. If they are drunk, be respectful and friendly, but don't let the conversation go on too long. Say something like "things will look a lot different once the alcohol is out of your system."
- 11. When calling the client to arrange a meeting or just to talk, never leave a message on their voice mail or with someone else especially the reason for your call. Remember anonymity is our foundation. (a good idea is to use the *67 feature on your phone if you can).
- 12. Do remember to evoke your higher power, whatever that means to you, say a little prayer, and then turn it over. You're now free to use your best judgment and trust everything will work out. Remember that service work is as much to help you as it is to help others. Be willing to give, and it will be returned.

What are Midnight Monitors?

These are people willing to take calls between 11:00 answering service who forwards calls, on rotation, occasionally getting someone on the 12 Step list to call them back the nextday.
