COMC works behind the AA scenes

The role of the Central Office Management Committee (COMC) probably doesn't mean much to most Calgary and area AA members working to understand the program of recovery and rebuild their lives.

But it is all the behind-the-scenes business details that keep Calgary Central Office open, meeting lists printed, and supplies and literature in the hands of home groups and individual members that is important to the primary purpose of AA described in Tradition 5 "carrying the message to alcoholics who still suffer."

Fortunately most AA members don't have to worry about the placement and cost of the Alcoholics Anonymous listing in the Yellow Pages, the amortization details of the new computer system at Central Office, or whether certain headings on the monthly financial statement could be deleted so other key figures fit on the page.

All those glamorous details and a mountain more, fall on the plate of the COMC — a committee created by Calgary Intergroup. As an elected group of nine business-minded AA members, COMC is charged with managing the operation of Central Office in Calgary, which serves as the hub of AA program delivery. COMC is funded by 7th tradition contributions, book store sales, as well as proceeds from Intergroup special events such as The Banff Roundup.

COMC plays a similar role in carrying the AA message of recovery, as a cake pan does in the creation of a favorite dessert. The pan itself contributes little if anything to the flavor of the cake, but without it the presentation would likely be a real mess.

Behind the fellowship and spiritual principles of recovery, which are forefront in the minds of AA members, is the very necessary task of looking after the business of AA in Calgary and area. For COMC members that includes the responsible management and proper reporting of all AA finances, renting and running an office, hiring a manager, maintaining a book store with AA literature and other supplies, paying the bills and otherwise keeping the lights on.

Currently serving on the COMC are Duane T. chair; Harry P. Intergroup chair; Kris M. Intergroup alternate chair; Jayne R. Intergroup treasurer; Mathew M. Office Manager and Louise M., Bert G., Rich W., and Daryl M., all members-at-large."

And it is Central Office business that COMC keeps in focus. During regular monthly COMC meetings, if discussion wanders into territory about the AA program or services, they don't hesitate to rein the meeting back to the committee's primary purpose – central office management.

Depending on the topic, the committee is quick to ask, "Is this a COMC or an Intergroup issue? We are here to manage the affairs of central office, not Intergroup", reminding all it may be a question best addressed by the group conscience of all Calgary AA members through the Intergroup network.

It is still home groups and individual AA members who are responsible when "anyone, anywhere reaches out for help.", but it is invisible hand of COMC that plays an important role in helping others observe the key traditions of carrying the message and maintaining AA unity upon which personal recovery depends.
