

It's About Money

If Calgary and Area AA members want to keep Calgary Central Service Office and other AA services operating at their current levels, we will need to step up to the plate financially.

Intergroup isn't broke, but there has been a prolonged shift in the revenue trend that could run the organization into trouble over the next couple of years, if more individual and group contributions or other revenue sources aren't forth coming.

A few years ago, group and individual contributions were the main source of income for Intergroup and Central Office operations. But that has changed in recent years, with group contributions dropping to less than 1/2 half of the funds needed to operate Central Office, and other AA related programs and services.

Individual and group contributions to Calgary Intergroup in the 2012 operations year were just over \$44,000 and the costs of Calgary Intergroup activities was \$111,900. Our mandate is to be self-supporting through contributions and our activities. While inflation continues unabated, contributions to Intergroup have not kept pace. Individual and group contributions this year made up just over 42% of the costs of Calgary Intergroup activities with the rest being provided by the Book Store and Calgary Intergroup sponsored events. There are limits to how much financial support these activities can provide and any short fall needs to be made up with individual or group contributions.

But there are some revenue generating options, members need to consider. Calgary AA as represented by Calgary Intergroup is registered as a charitable organization and as such individual contributions are income tax deductible.

Charitable Donations:

Many Calgary and area AA's have charities that we support annually and receive an income tax deduction as a result of these contributions. Please consider making Calgary Alcoholics Anonymous <u>YOUR PRIMARY</u> recipient by making **regular** individual donations through Calgary Central Service Office to a maximum of \$3000 per year. Unlike many charities, we do not have a minimum donation before tax receipts are issued. Donations can be made by cash, cheque, debit or credit card.

Here are several other programs that are in place for individuals who wish to contribute.

Birthday Program:

This program is where AA members donate money to AA on their sobriety date and belly-button birthday. Some AA's have chosen to donate a penny a day, others a dollar a year or other differing amounts. There is no required or fixed amount to participate, but it cannot exceed the maximum allowable annual contribution amount. At times these gifts have been recorded in the Westword unless the individual has specifically asked for anonymity.

Memorial Donations:

There are two types of initiatives here. First, as an AA member you can direct in your will that your estate contribute the maximum contribution allowable (currently \$5000 per member) in your name to AA. A tax receipt will be issued to your estate. Secondly, you can contribute as a member in memory of another member. In this case the receipt will be issued to you, to the maximum limitations of our 7th tradition contributions (currently \$ 3000 per year). For information on this type of contribution please contact the Calgary Central Service Office.

Remember, how much and what services AA provides in Calgary is directly linked to the financial support of our membership. This concern is not unique to Calgary AA as other regions are experiencing similar concerns with static contributions and inflation driven rising costs. Please help if you can to sustain our current level of AA service in Calgary by taking part in one or more of these programs.

We are expanding and do need help from people who are interested in helping the professional help us.


We are currently influencing young Doctors and Nurses at both Universities and will soon be doing presentations for the Social Work faculties.
