

IT'\$ About Money!

Group and Individual contributions are an important part of being self-supporting. Financial contributions to the Calgary Intergroup funds activities that carry the message to alcoholics that still suffer, as well as, supporting those in recovery. The following graphs indicate the level of group and individual contributions for the last ten years and reflect the percent contribution that each revenue source provides to the total of Calgary Intergroup operating costs.



*2012 data includes 10 months actual and 2 months proforma

As you can see, group and individual contributions seem to have declined by 20% over the last seven years while revenue from other sources has been required to supplement funding for continued Intergroup operations in the face of rising costs. This is a concern as the other revenue sources can swing considerably from one year to the next. Calgary Intergroup's prudent reserve (defined to be 6 months of operating expenses) continues to be underfunded and we have not been able to make any contributions to the reserve in some time. The value of the prudent reserve basically remains the same while operating expenses continue to increase. This in turn reduces the number of months of operating costs the prudent reserve can fund if required. We need to fully fund the prudent reserve to ensure Calgary Intergroup's financial integrity. To this end on October 27th, the Central Office Management Committee will sponsor a brainstorming workshop to look for ideas on how to increase the prudent reserve to the 6 month operating expense goal. What is the 12 Step List?

This list contains the AA members who are willing to have their names and phone numbers listed for 12 Step calls.

Listings are by area of the city and home group.

The list is used by phone monitors when a caller needs to talk with another alcoholic.

You may talk with them a short time or for a long time. Or, with another AA friend*, you may meet them for a coffee, take them to a meeting, or visit them in their home.

You list your available times and what parts of the city you are willing to travel to.

A car is helpful but not necessary.

How to sign up

Return this application form to Central Service
Office or to your Intergroup Representative.
Once you are on the list, any changes you want
to make just call Central Service
Office and ask for Mathew.

What are Midnight Monitors?

These are people willing to take calls between 11:00 at night and 8:30 in the morning.

Their phone numbers are given to the answering service who forwards calls, on rotation, directly to them during that time.

It usually involves only talking & listening, and occasionally getting someone on the 12 Step list to call them back the next day.

^{*} Never go on a 12 Step Call on your own.
