If you are involved in AA there are probably few valid reasons why you shouldn't have your name on the 12th Step Call List. It doesn't cost anything, and in my experience it doesn't require a great deal of time, yet it can be such an important link in getting a suffering alcoholic to his or her first meeting.

Being involved on the 12 Step Call List covers two of the fundamental bases hammered home in AA — the Responsibility Statement which says "When anyone, anywhere reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there" and the principle of the 12th Step that says "practical experience shows that nothing will so much insure immunity from drinking as intensive worth with other alcoholics."

The 12th Step Call list is an important support document available to all AA members involved in telephone monitoring. When a call comes in to AA from a new (or potential) or existing AA member who wants more information on the AA program, the call monitor turns to the 12th Step Call list to have one of the members listed there talk to this individual. (Ideally if you have a year or more sobriety, fill out the form with pertinent basic contact information and you'll be on the 12th Step Call List.)

NOT A HEAVY LOAD

I have been on the 12 Step Call List for about four years and probably get one to three calls a year so again, in my experience, the workload isn't heavy. I don't know if I handle these calls properly, but I handle them the best I can.

Some people just want to talk about what AA is, how does it work, how long do I have to attend the program? Some people have asked me to decide if they are an alcoholic or not. I offer to get them a pamphlet with the 20 questions.

I remember meeting one man for coffee one night, who said he and his girlfriend may have a drinking problem because they get drunk every weekend, and the drinking was causing problems in their lives. Was he a drunk, and what is AA was all about? He seemed genuinely interested in my very

compelling explanation until eventually I mentioned the word God or the concept of finding a higher power. He then quickly finished his coffee and left saying he thought he would just try not drinking for a while.

Another young man was sober when I returned his call, but he knew he had to do something about his drinking and had never been to AA. It was a Saturday afternoon and I took him to his first meeting at the Garnet Block on 14th Street. It was a small, but usually good topic and discussion meeting. I got him a meeting list, a copy of the Big Book, urged him to read it, attend more meetings and call me again anytime. I never heard from him again.

A few times I have returned calls to people who are still actively drinking and probably quite drunk. They usually have a tearful story about how life isn't going well, I tell them they probably have a serious disease. I urge them, if they are serious, to stop drinking now, get sober, get their head clear and call me the next day and we'll get to a meeting. I don't believe I've had any call backs.

MEASURE SUCCESS

Some people might say I haven't had great success with 12th Step Calls, and yes it would be nice if everyone I talked to went forward and grasped the AA program. But as my friend Roger D. often says about the AA program, "you can lead a horse to water, and you can't make him drink, but you can salt the oats." Maybe I don't get these folks started on the steps, but maybe they hear something and the second or third time they speak to a 12th Step Call List member they are finally ready to take action.

And as my friend Don D. says after 30 years of active service in AA, he's had 100 per cent success with sponsees in AA, because he has stayed sober. So far I've had the same success with 12^{th} Step Calls.


